This was a year of dramatic change for Love a Village.

In May, our implementing partner Daniel Nyirenda left the security of his job working in Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WaSH), to work full time with his NGO, *Rural Development Partners (RDP)*. This change means that our Love a Village projects (Clean Water, Food Security, Safe Shelter, Health & Hygiene and Education) are now being implemented on a full time basis, not just when Julie visits Malawi. We have observed that they are being done on a far grander, more detailed, and greatly impressive scale.

RDP and their three volunteers are now in the community on a daily basis! They continue our water projects, and have started up the following **new** items:

- Compost Training
- Mushroom Farming
- New Farming Techniques
- Toilet Building
- Bee Keeping
- Roofing
- Sanitation & Hygiene campaigns
- and more!

Our new home and office

Chanju means **LOVE** in the Malawian dialect Chitonga. We chose this name for our new home because of the **LOVE** we hope to share and offer through our partnership with Rural Development Partners, and because it is the mother tongue of our partner Daniel. (plus it sounded way better than the Tumbuka word for love. lol)



The story behind how we came to rent this home is long, complicated, and ridiculously sublime.

Through a set of unrelated connections (Trevor's cousin, Julie's sister, a co-worker of Dan's wife), and a string of "coincidences" that would raise eyebrows among Hollywood screenwriters, that all

occurred at the opposite end of the country, where we've never visited before, we are now renting this home in the north near Luhomero with RDP. It serves as both an office and a place for us to live when we are visiting. We are deeply thankful to God for providing us with such an incredible gift, and in such an amazing way, reminding us that He is in all the details, and that He is able to do things far beyond our imagination, dreams and hopes.

LAV & RDP look forward to years of being able to **LOVE** our Malawian friends together, through our projects and through the gift of hospitality in our new home & office, Chanju!




Mushroom Farming

This has been an incredible year of change and hope for our village friends! Mushroom farming is just one of many new initiatives being implemented.

These beautiful, tasty oyster mushrooms are providing our friends with food and income. This project's modest new income stream helps villagers pay for basic necessities that were previously out of reach.

Committees are being trained on how to build a mushroom hut structure, and how to manage the growth, sales, and savings associated with their project.

Amazingly, people around are observing all of the new things happening, and are asking to be next in line for training. Some have even started these projects on their own initiative because they are so eager to find ways to earn income to help their families.

So incredibly unbelievable! We have been blessed by YOU with a reliable truck to get us, our supplies, and people in and out of the community. This vehicle will be used to serve and care for literally thousands of people.

Partnerships

We love that we are able to partner together with Malawians in order to fight this battle. We have found that there are so many people eager to work together and share resources of knowledge and heart. Here are a few of the partnerships we had in 2017.

SMART Centre

1. Digging shallow wells and training villagers to maintain them. Hiring Malawians trained in for installation and training in use.

Foundations For Farming (FFF)

2. Training in new farming technique, boasting up to 3x previous yields, composting, mushroom farming, and in 2018 ... bee keeping.

Other Communities

3. A 3 day field trip to learn from other farmers how and why FFF is worth doing! This was a fantastic boost of encouragement!

Government Programmes

4. Health & Hygiene campaigns: masses of AV equipment were driven in to multiple sites. Along with dramas, the importance of proper hygiene was taught.

Local leaders

5. Village headsmen, District Council, Village Councils, Traditional Authorities, and more!

GOAL: for each villager to become independent through clean water, food security, safe shelter, toilets, healthy lives, and access to education!

Our generation's battle & responsibility

It's hard for us to understand why there's still extreme poverty in our lifetime. How is it possible that in 2018, there is such a vast extreme between the impoverished and the wealthy? Consider some significant barriers:

World Bank:

"The work to end extreme poverty is far from over, and a number of challenges remain. It is becoming even more difficult to reach those remaining in extreme poverty, who often live in fragile contexts and remote areas. Access to good schools, healthcare, electricity, safe water and other critical services remains elusive for many people, often determined by socioeconomic status, gender, ethnicity, and geography.

- *A vast majority of the global poor live in rural areas and are poorly educated, mostly employed in the agricultural sector, and over half are under 18 years of age."*

This describes our village friends. They are extremely vulnerable. Yet, THEY are fighting a battle that is OUR responsibility to fight. Right now. Because, nobody should have to fight for basic human rights and needs alone, without any resources to do so. We wouldn't want to. Why should THEY when WE have these things in abundance, and means with which to help them?

Working together, we can change this!
